6.20.07 - "Wheat harvest is under way in the San Joaquin Delta. We just finished the variety trial harvest on Victoria Island showing high yields. Overall, well managed fields are producing excellent yields and high proteins. Some growers with open contracts are taking advantage of higher prices. It is the happiest I've seen wheat growers in years!" *Mick Canevari*

6.21.07 - "Overall crop quality is excellent. Test weights 62-66 lbs, yields are coming in

well above average." *Mike Holdsworth,*

6.21.07 – "My guess is that we may be half way done with harvest. Many growers in our area are getting 80-90 sack yields per acre." Tom Millar, Glenn County

6-21-07 - "We are seeing higher yields and proteins than we have seen in a few years. Most all of our wheat is over 11% protein, 62-65 pound test weights, 400 Falling Numbers." Larry Hunn, Clarksburg, CA

6-21-07 – "Dryland wheat farmers from Salinas to Santa Barbara have little to no crop to harvest. For the few acres that are irrigated in this region, harvest may begin later next week." Charles Darway, San Luis Obispo, CA

6-21-07 – "Crop progress is normal. Winter wheat is headed out and pollinating. Spring red is heading. No significant rust reports yet. White spring is in the boot. Overall, the wheat stand is variable due to late winter and spring frost." J.W. Cope, Winema Elevators, Tulelake, CA
